- Uses available State funding. That statement is true, but will the State then have a say in how the building is built? It happened to other districts.
- Attracts families. This may be true, but is the building being proposed going to handle an influx of students? Or will we need to add on immediately?
- More energy efficient. Maybe true for the new building, but what about the remaining building? Will the current gym/cafeteria/band room area need to be upgraded for the public to use? And who will be responsible for that area and expenses?
