

ATTENTION FAIRBORN RESIDENTS

Say **NO** to a 24 hour truck stop in Fairborn city limits

WaWa Gas Station Corporation is another gas station making plans to build in our area. Fairborn is 14 square miles and currently has a minimum of 25 regular gas stations, which equates for a gas station every 1.8 square miles, which is excessive in a city with approximately 35,000 residents.

The WaWa Corporation tried to build a regular gas station on Dayton Yellow Springs Road at Five Points in Fairborn last year, but was rejected by the City Council and residents. Now they are proposing to build a 24 Hour Truck Stop at the corner of Broad Street and Spangler Road within our city limits - less than one mile from the center of downtown.

Fairborn does not need a 24 hour truck stop and all the bad elements it brings within our city limits. We do not want big city problems in our small community.

- ✓ There are four (4) existing 24 hour truck stops with overnight parking to accommodate hundreds of trucks within a 12-15 mile radius going north, south, east and west on I-70 and I-75 - therefore putting a 24 hour Truck Stop within the city limits of Fairborn is not necessary or needed for our city.
 - ✓ A truck stop would bring excessive traffic congestion on Broad St and Spangler Roads - especially those individuals entering and existing 675 ramps at SR 444/Enon exit
 - ✓ A 24 Hour Truck Stop would bring Crime such as sex trafficking, human trafficking, drugs and other problems into our city
 - ✓ Proposed truck stop would be 40 feet from the newly built bike path, which raises safety concerns for families and children utilizing the bike path.
