Senator Hinojosa, together with the Rio Grande Valley Delegation, has passed legislation and secured funding to expand the South Texas economy and benefit our families. **THE RESULTS:**

- Fully funded public education commitments under HB 3 and maintained the \$11.5 billion investment including protecting funding for teacher and school employee salary increases.
- Lead author of Senate Bill 24, legislation that created the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley and the UTRGV School of Medicine.
- \$44.9 million appropriated to UTRGV that will be applied for the construction of the UT Health RGV Cancer and Surgery Center.
- Supported South Texas College with increased formula funding and grant funding for job training programs.
- Secured more than \$300 million for the Pharr Interchange Replacement Project.
- \$8.5 million since 2017 for the Center for Urban Ecology at Quinta Mazatlan in McAllen.
- \$10 million for the South Texas International Airport in Edinburg since 2019.
- Grant funding for the City of Mission to construct the Tennis Center in Birdwell Park and funds to expand and make improvements to the Rio Grande Valley State Veterans Cemetery.
- \$3.2 million in state funding for the Texas Department of Public Safety La Joya Area Office.
- Grant funding for the Villa Garza Flores and Valle Alto Parks in the City of Hidalgo; \$300,000 for the Nature Park in the City of Palmview.
- \$400,000 for the Penitas Public Library and \$100,000 for the preservation of the St. Anthony Cemetery.
- Passed legislation and secured funding for our international ports of entry that will lead to the expansion of the Anzalduas and Pharr bridges.
- \$3.45 million in grants in 2022 to 16 organizations that serve South Texas veterans in the Rio Grande Valley and Corpus Christi areas. These grants are part of the \$31.5 million approved to provide 139 grants to over 120 organizations that serve more than 22,000 veterans throughout the state.
