Airspace by FAA consisting of a Restricted Area for a "Tethered Maritime Surveillance System" (TMSS). The balloon-borne radar system provides long-range detection of low-altitude aircraft to detect and track suspicious air traffic. The Proposed Action ensures protection of the approximately 200-mile-long coastline in South Padre Island, which is frequently used by transnational criminal organizations for smuggling narcotics and people. The Draft EA evaluates potential impacts on the environment from the Proposed Action and the No Action Alternative. The Draft EA demonstrates that the Proposed Action would not significantly impact the environment and based
